Below are the examples of the successful


lighting and how it takes center stage in a room. Have fun!

Outdoor Lighting



The Arramore Collection- Monte Carlo by Feiss. Even if your porch is as plain as day these exquisite sconces will be a show stopper. They are constructed of LED halo rings that graze down the delicate pattern. The color warms up when it is dimmed. So be prepared to entertain long after Labor Day.

Entry Lighting



Gem Hanging Pendant by Kevin Reilly for Holly Hunt Why is it working? It's timeless and suitable for any decor. The rustic, architectural, romantic and industrial are fused itogether creating warmth and romantic allure.

Living Room Lighting


Bathroom Lighting



Enchanted by Corbet Lighting. The name of this lighting fixture says it all. It's organic shapes take you to the fantasy world where anything is possible. If you wish, make the ceiling color or pattern stand out and leave the walls and furnishings as simple as possible. The chandelier casts soft light and it is dimmable LED base.



Parc Royale by Corbet Lighting. My client fell in love with this lighting fixture. I sourced a mirror that is a perfect style and then matched the wood finish. I had the electrician install wall washers on the ceiling to showcase the accent mosaic wall. Now all three- the wall, the lighting fixture and the mirror become the primary focus.



Bristol Sconce by Aerin for Circa Lighting. It is fun and confident at the same time. Use these sconces as part of your design concept and don't be afraid to use stencils or wall art to achieve an almost theatrical effect. Since these fixtures fit only 40 watts bulbs consider additional ceiling lighting.

Dining Room Lighting

Who says that the only lighting option for a dining room is a chandelier? Consider a grouping of pendants instead for truly dramatic efect. In this case, the circular shape creates a ring of light that appears to float effortlessly in space. The warm ringed glow from internally focused LED lamping provides both the presence and the absence of volume. The illumination from the interior of the fixture is echoed in the subtly illuminated edge of its external perimeter. Dimmable with an electronic low voltage dimmer.

"I have two of the 16" aluminum pendants hanging above my dining room table. They are stunning. Very crisp, clean contemporary look. The discs appear to be effortlessly floating above the table. The greater the distance the fixtures hang from the ceiling the better! Love the

dimmable circular LED bulbs too."

Bedroom Lighting



Andover 4-Light Chandelier by Hudson Valley Lighting. Here magic happens when a classically inspired form is married to a modern acrylic material. It retains a light beam's reflection and carries it unbroken to the edge. How deliciously elegant!
